May is also the month when we should start preparing for the Hurricane Season. Unfortunately the prediction is for a larger than average number of storms. Preparations should include the following:

- Prepare a plan, if you plan to evacuate. Let a member of the Board know that you are leaving town so that we can watch your home.
- Start pruning your trees and other foliage. Trees cause the most damage when storms hit.
- Be prepared to take in outdoor furniture and secure flower pots so they do not become projectiles.
- Stock up on water, and non-perishable foods.

- Make sure your flashlights work. Invest in new batteries if necessary.

Some improvements the Board has made are:

- Gutters have been installed around the front of the clubhouse which should eliminate the water entering the clubhouse during a big storm.
- New chairs have been purchased for around the pool. We removed any chair that had rust
 on it or so dirty that it could not be cleaned. The Civic Fund purchased 16 new chairs and
 Kevin F. is assembling them for use.

MESSAGE FROM THE VICE-PRESIDENT

Another month is gone, a busy month. Believe it or not one quarter of the year is done. How time flies in retirement.

As mentioned, we had a busy month, a gutter system was installed on the building front. The lights have been replaced for our sign and the flagpole. We purchased and assembled new patio chairs, eliminating the old blue and white chairs. We are planning on spraying/applying weed kill and fertilizer on the community lawns. This can be accomplished only if sprinklers are working.

Which brings me to my main nemesis, the sprinkler system. I've been on this problem on a daily basis. Have met with David, from CPM Irrigation, to go over the problems. We had a couple of major brakes, on NW 44th St. and NW 45th St. Then, CPM ran into minor breaks, due to old cheap lines and air pockets. Then they ran into a very confusing problem. We have 13 timers for approximately 72 zones. We have found out that some timers have been manipulated with, either to increase spray time or decrease. Whoever is doing this doesn't understand that that timer runs up to eight zones, not just their lot. Which changes the pressure in the system, which causes breaks in old lines. Also, some sprinkler heads have been replaced by some property owners. That creates a problem, pressure wise. The other problem, which is confusing, during a test, all the sprinklers are working per zone. But, when the cycle is turn on at night, certain zones are not getting signals to turn on. Therefore, you've seen CPM around here working on one zone at a time. They are trying really hard to correct our antiquated system. They have to work system by system, not jumping around to individual complaints. So, please, bear with me and them, it will take a little more time for the sprinkler system to work properly. **THANK YOU** in advance.

One more regarding sprinklers, please DON'T call Campbell, call me. I will communicate the problems to CPM, no matter how minor.


